Lalomalava Abattoir infatuates CDC Chairman

Minister of Agriculture Lopao'o Natanielu Mua's wish for the abattoir services offered by his Ministry's Livestock Division to be a Private Sector driven industry is beginning to become true.

And Prime Minister Tuilaepa Sailele Malielegaoi and the Cabinet Development Committee are beginning to understand the logic behind Lopao'o's wish after visiting the Gidlow's soon to open abattoir operations at Lalomalava Savaii last Thursday.

Already Roger Gidlow, the co-founder with his wife who is a former Cabinet Minister and current Member of Parliament Gatolai Amataga Alesana Gidlow have been providing a market for Savaii cattle farmers through their mobile abattoir operations.

They have been providing twice a week abattoir services for Savaii cattle farms island wide and shipping the process meat to Upolu once a week to clients such as Frankie's and a number of restaurants.

The processed beef is certified by the MAF's Livestock Division via meat inspectors as required by law.

And with their Abattoir Factory to be certified later this week, it will provide a guarantee and sustainable income market for Savaii cattle farmers.

The Gidlow's initiative is funded through a partnerships developed by Government with the Asian Development Bank's Samoa's Agribusiness Support Project launched several years.

And Prime Minister Tuilaepa Sailele Malielegaoi is infatuated with the Gidlow's ingenuity to tap into financing programs provided by Government.

"Cattle farmers in Savaii now have a secured weekly income from the sustainable market developed by Roger Gidlow and his family," complimented the Prime Minister. "This type of innovating initiative is rare now a days and it's an example for our business entrepreneurs to follow."

Re-instate domestic flights to Savaii, PM dares

Government is daring inter-island commercial airlines to reopen domestic flights between Faleolo and Maota Airport in Asau Savaii.

The public dare made by Prime Minister and Chairman of the Cabinet Development Committee, (CDC) Tuilaepa Sailele Malielegaoi after visiting Savaii last week with over 60 Committee members.

"The Maota Airport is in full operational and more than ready for domestic flights as well as inter-island flights with American Samoa to resume," says the Prime Minister.

CDC evaluates Vaipouli Health Facility's future

There fate of the former Vaipouli Health Facility is in the hands of the Cabinet Development Committee, (CDC).

Recently converted into an Emergency Isolation Facility during the measles crisis, several options were presented to the CDC Committee during its on-site visits to look and learn first-hand the progress to government development project in Savaii.

The delegation was led by CDC Chairman and Prime Minister Tuilaepa Sailele Malielegaoi and Committee members include Cabinet Ministers and Chief Executive Officers from all Government entities for consideration.

One option now before the CDC is to convert the Facility into a Training Center for Nursing and Medical Students with the National University of Samoa and for Samoa's first Emergency Medical Team personnel.

And Prime Minister Tuilaepa is receptive to the change of plans but also added his recommendations that included the Komiti Tumama for Women and a Maternal Ward for the Fagamalo District in the list of considerations for the CDC to review.

"The change in plan reflects a responsible government which acts immediately to change and implement reforms to better suit the needs of the people," says the Prime Minister. "This Government is well known to change with the times and as we all know, health has been and will continue to be one of the top government priorities."

The Vaipouli Facility was intended for a District Hospital to serve Fagamalo. However the plan was aborted with the measles crisis changing the Ministry of Health's plan turning Vaipouli as the Isolation Unit for all Measles cases in Savaii.

MoH however continues to maintain the facility under its Outreach Program with a Nurse and Doctor stationed at Vaipouli once a week.

Lalomalava Abattoir infatuates CDC Chairman

"Witnessing the Gidlow's success story through working with our Livestock Division to facilitate and assist with a new market outlet also speaks volumes for the Government's Private and Public Partnership platform," said the Prime Minister.

And the Gidlow's success is setting a new inspiring precedent not just for Savaii Livestock farmers but for the entire country, complimented Chief Livestock Officer Aiolupotea Tony Aiolupotea.

The Lalomalava Abattoir is one of 8 projects visited by the CDC during its onsite inspections of development projects in Savaii last week.

Re-instate domestic flights to Savaii, PM dares

"It begs the question, why schedule flights between Maota and Faleolo has not been re-instated," he added.

Presently Samoa Airways is flying chartered flights and emergency medical evacuation flights between Maota Airport and Faleolo.

But the schedule flights on a daily basis has been suspended for some time now by the national carrier citing financial hardship as the reasons.

But it's not detaining the Prime Minister from calling out Samoa Airways, reiterating that if the airline is truly Samoa's flag carrier, their domestic services to Savaii should be reinstated as soon as possible.

Meanwhile, the Samoa Airport Authority, (SAA) is keeping all doors open for domestic flights between Upolu, Savaii and interisland flights between Maota Airport and Tafuna in American Samoa to resume.

"The Maota Airport is still operational and has been since 1997 when it first started operation," says Authority's Chief Executive Silimanai Ueta Junior Solomona

"The Maota Airport has never been closed," reiterated the SAA Chief Executive.
"It's just that there are no airplanes using the airport, and it's only used for emergency medical evacuation."

"There are no scheduled services at the moment, but are continuing talks with the Samoa Airways that we are ready to resume flights at Maota.

"The Talofa Airways has also shown interest to service the Maota - American Samoa route, but nothing has been settled yet because it takes up to eight months to do preparations and assessments."

Silamanai said they spend about \$200,000.00 a year in maintenance costs for the Maota Airport, and there are four permanent staff employed there.

"The competition is high with the interisland vessels that service the Upolu-Savaii route. But Government insist that we maintain the Maota Airport."

Silamanai said with the closure of the Fagalii Airport they are looking at upgrading the Asau Airport.
"We can only maintain the airports, but it's up to the airlines if they want to use it."



Savaii development projects comes under CDC microscope

All government development projects are now subject to on-site visitation reviews by the Cabinet Development Committee, (CDC).

The decision is the result of a successful full day of inspections of major development project in Savaii by CDC led by Chairman and Prime Minister Tuilaepa Sailele Malielegaoi last week for a look and learn first hand to 8 projects in Savaii last week.

The projects inspected by the CDC delegation of Cabinet Ministers, Chief Executives and senior public servants include;

- Health Facility at Vaipouli
- Mali'oli'o Bridge and Patamea Road
- Cattle Farm at Vaia'ata
- Vaia'ata Prisons
- Sheep Farm and Abattoir
- Maota Airport
- MJCA New Site Salelologa

• SNPF New Site Salelologa

And the inspection is crucial for the government to check if the projects' progress are proceeding on schedule and should there be any hick-ups government must take immediate actions.

"The on-site visits by the CDC is a regular fixture and reflects that Cabinet does not make decisions solely based on paper reports," said Prime Minister Tuilaepa.

"It also shows that we are a working government from Cabinet Ministers to CEOs and all relevant senior Public Servants, we all play our role as laid out in our Strategy for the Development of Samoa.

"But paramount to Cabinet is that if there are problems then it needs to be fixed. And that cannot happen in our offices but out on the ground and in the field."

Most important to the Prime Minister is for the public to be informed on what government is doing for their benefits.

"Do not fear the negative media coverage but address it so that

our people will know the facts instead of relying on one-sided and superficial reports on social media and even newspapers," he continued.

"If there are any articles that has your name is mentioned do not get offended but look beyond the article and see what you need to work on with your ministry so that next time you will not be the on front page."

"But if you want to response to any of the articles that has your name mentioned there is our Savali Newspaper and Press Secretariat that is available as a vehicle to address inaccuracies published by the newspapers.

"Let our people know that government is not resting on its laurels and government's priority remains and will continue to be for the benefit of our people."

CDC in the coming months will be returning to Savaii to complete its on-site visits to government development projects not covered during last week.

Permanent home for SNPF in Saleleoga

By this time next year, the Samoa National Provident Fund (SNPF) will no longer be a tenant but a homeowner and a permanent fixture on the Big Island of Savaii.

Since 1963, the Fund have been renting space on the Big Island to maintain services Savaii contributors. And 16 years later, SNPF's permanent residency status is about to become a reality.

In the pipeline is the new SNPF two storey headquarters to be constructed in Salelologa about 50 meters from the Market.

And tentatively, ground-breaking is scheduled for later this month.

Presently the Fund is renting space near the Salelologa Market but with the new two storey office complex it will mean more room for staff

to better accommodate the needs of the Fund's members, says SNPF Chief Executive Pauli Prince Shuren.

"Our current location is providing all the services available in Apia," he added. "But with the growing number of members, demand for improved services from our Savaii members are more audible than ever before."

The ground floor will house the Fund's Main Office, a Bank and a Cafe and the second floor will be dedicated as Conference Facilities for meetings.

If all goes well, the new SNPF Office will be dedicated and opened for business by February next year.

Established in 1972, the SNPF membership has slowly but surely blossomed to over 35,000 current active members.

Tuasivi Court House relocates to Salelologa

It's all systems go for the Tuasivi Court House relocation project to her new home in Salelologa.

Scheduled for completion next January, the project received initial Cabinet approval in 2017.

And its design covers four major improvements, explains the Ministry of Justice Chief Executive, Molie Simi-Vaai

"The Court House will include a number of Lands and Titles Court Rooms; Multipurpose Supreme & District Court Courtroom; Multipurpose rooms for mediation, interview room and family conferences room," said Mrs Vaai.

It will be furnished with a sound system, she added noting that other accessories that includes air

conditioning, secured custodial access, and video conferencing will be included.

"There will be an office space for the ACEO Savaii office and the 27 staff members, an office for the Lands and Title's Court President and Judges, and accommodations for judges in the premises," says the Chief Executive.

Tentatively, tenders will be advertised soon with construction targeted to start in July.

And a steering committee to lead and manage the implementation of the project is in charge with Minister of Justice, Afioga Faaolesa Katopau Ainu'u as Chairman and include the CEOs of the Ministry of Finance, Ministry of Works, Samoa Land Corporation, the Attorney General and Vaai as the Committee Secretary.

At the 62nd Meeting of the N.U.S Council held on the 3rd and 4th October 2019, Council endorsed the selection of Prof. Aiono as the new Vice Chancellor and President.

Samoa's first PTP program female graduate

(PRESS RELEASE); A Samoan woman that was studying and working in carpentry in New Zealand under the Pacific Trade Partnership (PTP) program facilitated by the Ministry of Business Innovation and Employment (MBIE) in partnership with the Ministry of Commerce Industry and Labour (MCIL) had been given a 3 year work contract to work at the ARA company in Christchurch.

Maaola Fiu Pepe aged 26 hails from the village of Sili Savaii had the opportunity to study carpentry and work under a scholarship offered by the Center of Assessment of Prior Learning (CAPL) at ARA Institute in New Zealand in February last year. Fiupepe's application to be recruited under the PTP was assessed and approved by ARA officials who came to Samoa to do their recruitment in partnership with MCIL and NUS.

Armed with practical experience and a Level III Certificate in Car-

penry from the APTC in Samoa, Fiupepe was the recipient of the "Sally Marfarlane Legacy Scholarship for Pacific Women in Trades", that provides additional support with her tools and pastoral care, whilst in New Zealand.

Since then she managed to pass her NZQA Level 4 Certificate in Carpentry and was given a 3 years job offer to work for Tradestaff to gain further experience.

She is the first Samoan woman that passed the NZQA level 4 Certificate under the Pacific Trade Partnership (PTP). To mark her success, a celebration was held on the 24th of January to celebrate her huge achievement with the ARA graduation to be held at the end of March 2020. The celebration was attended by Samoa's Trade Commissioner, Magele Mauiliu Magele and Counselor Belinda Filo.

Maaola's story is inspiring for young women who are considering

study in trades sector. She hopes her story will inspire other young women to be part of the program. One of the key priorities under MCIL's Action plan in partnership with MBIE is the development of strategies that aims at encouraging the participation of Samoan woman in trades as well as other work opportunities under seasonal work and related programs.

PTP is one of the schemes that benefits Samoan men and women who have completed Level III Certificate in Trades and Apprenticeship. The scheme offers qualified men and women from Samoa a job offer of one year to work in New Zealand towards a Level 4 Certificate.

MCIL acknowledges the support of Rev Fitifiti Lutua and his wife for their continuous mentoring and moral advice for Maaola during her time in Christchurch.

New Vai'a'ata Prison

A new cell block for prisoners and Office facilities should be completed and commissioned by June this year.

The new Vaia'aata Prinson complement project is part of the Prisoners' Rehabilitation Programs as requested and approved by Government. Samoa Prisons and Correction Services, (SPCS) role on management of prisoners now focus' on rehabilitating prisoners so that they can provide for them-

selves and families after serving their sentence. It is for this reason that the Vai'a'ata Prison is built by Prisoners who are qualified for construction works, under the guidance of the Prison Minister, Tialavea Fea Leniu Tionisio Hunt. The project costs \$600,000 tala and funded locally. It was inspected last week by the Cabinet Development Committee.

of cancers that are common in men include lung, prostate, colorectal, stomach and liver cancer whereas breast, colorectal, lung, cervical and thyroid are most common among women worldwide.

In Samoa, there is an increased number of people that die every year due to cancer and other cancer related diseases. Even though the new diagnosed cases have almost the same number of men and women, women generally have more cases every year. Common cancers among women in Samoa are breast cancer and lung cancer, and the number of new cases of women with breast cancer in 2018 was 67 which was the highest amongst all cancers. Prostate cancer is the highest amongst men and the number of new cases as of 2018 was 39, and 34 new cases for lung cancer. In 2019, there were 76 cancer related deaths recorded. Although most of these cancer patients went through treatment and received medications, they were diagnosed late.

This number of recorded cases does not include those that were not diagnosed or registered in the Samoa Cancer Society or the Hospital facilities records. These cases were those that presented late signs of the disease and were cared for at home or sought treatment overseas without being registered locally.

Cancer diseases' main caveat is late presentation which primes to late diagnosis. Late diagnosis consequently means lower chances of a successful treatment through medications and fewer years of life to patients. In many such cases, treatment is very aggressive taking a toll on the patients physically, emotionally and mentally. With late presentation cases, the impacts would also take a toll on the health system with high costs of treatment putting strain on resources needed to treat other diseases. Therefore, early detection is the best preventative measure through early presentation and screening. Screening and early detection can mean less treatment if diagnosed at the early stage of the development of the cancer.

On the other hand, to reduce the risk of getting cancer, a healthy lifestyle is vital through balanced intake of nutrition, alcohol control, no-smoking and being physically active. These measures should be practiced regularly and consistently to ensure healthy living not only to combat cancer but for all other non-communicable diseases.

Multiple collaborative efforts by the government of Samoa through the Ministry of Health and its key stakeholders, especially the Samoa Cancer Society, communities and the individuals have been

carried out to combat this disease. In 2018 the Ministry of Health in collaboration with the Samoa Cancer Society had its first Palliative Care Consultation with the aim of developing the Palliative Care Guideline which would provide support for patients diagnosed with serious long-term and lifethreatening illnesses including cancer. In addition to the Palliative Care Guideline, a Cancer Registry was also developed to account for the registration of cancer patients for early referral and early treatment.

Other cancer policies include the Draft Cervical Cancer policy which is currently in the process of peer review before its finalization. It is also timely, that Samoa will be introducing a new vaccine which is HPV (Human papillomavirus) that targets girls and boys of ages 11-12 to help protect them against certain types of HPV that can lead to cervical cancer and genital warts.

Risk factors of cancer such as smoking are being addressed under the Framework Convention on Tobacco Control (FCTC) Samoa 2030 Project. In 2019, Samoa officially presented its first Investment Case Report on the Burden of Tobacco Smoking which highlights the detrimental effects of tobacco smoking in relation to lung cancer and the costs affiliated. Awareness campaigns have been and are continuously conducted to educate the public on the importance of early detection and prevention. All these efforts could not have been done without the tremendous and continuous support of the government stakeholders including both public and private, NGOs especially the Samoa Cancer Society and the communities.

On Sunday 2nd of February, a special service was held at the Matafele Methodist Church spearheaded by the Samoa Cancer Society and supported by the Ministry of Health to commemorate this year's event and to remember those that are still living with cancer and those that have passed on. We will continue with our awareness campaigns with the aim that every individual is well informed of the gruesome reality of this deadly disease and of the preventive measures being advocated. We strongly advise the public to have regular checks at the doctor for early detection and early treatment. I acknowledge with enormous gratitude the continuous support of our partners, the government ministries, churches, the private sector, and NGOs for contributing towards our efforts to fight against cancer.

May Samoa be protected from cancer and all other diseases

World Cancer Day is commemorated every year on the 4th of February with the aim to upscale preventive measures through education and raising awareness about the cancer disease. Globally, the impacts of cancer continue to accelerate affecting millions of people worldwide and continuously putting stress on healthcare systems and services both socially and economically. The theme for this year's commemoration is underlined with the statement of 'I am, I will' which signifies the pledge of every country in the world with the involvement of both the public and private sectors, health services, communities, individuals, and government determinations and support unified in a collective fight against this disease.

According to the World Health Organization, cancer is the second leading cause of death globally, which accounts 'to an estimated 9.6 million deaths or one in six deaths, in 2018 and with a recent increase to 18.1million new cases'. 'More than 300,000 children and adolescents are diagnosed with cancer each year'. Different types

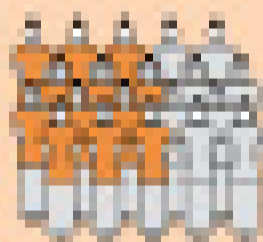

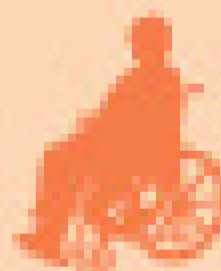
